Koeleria Glauca 'Blue Hair Grass'

Blue-green leaves, mound-forming, borders and containers. 25cm. Blue Hair grass is an ideal border plant, non-invasive and attractive as an accent or along an edge. In hot dry conditions, ample water and light shade bring out the best in this grass, but it will tolerate the exposed condition of a rock garden. This grass prefers lean soil and will not look its best when grown in rich soil.

Blue Hair grass has fantastic foliage and nice flowers, which are excellent in dried flower arrangements.

A semi-evergreen grass with silvery-blue foliage, and shiny spike-like panicles blooming in early summer. Grows to 2 feet tall. Used in mass plantings for their attractive flowers or as specimen plants in shady areas of a rock garden.

Position: full sun or partial shade

Soil: well-drained soil

Rate of growth: average

Flowering period: June to July

Hardiness: fully hardy

A tuft-forming evergreen grass with pretty, grey-green leaves, and dense silver green flower spikelets that fade to buff in the autumn. It prefers dry soils and will tolerate an exposed spot

Garden care: Comb through the plant in winter with your fingers to remove dead foliage

This cool-loving perennial is grown both for its attractive blue-green foliage and flowers. The flowering season is spring to early summer and is a good grass for sunny, dry even poor soils. The mature height is 18 inches tall by 20 inches wide mound.
